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# CHIP Annual Report 2024



Community Health In Action (CHIA) is the Coalition leading the ongoing, community-led process that defines health needs, sets priorities, and creates an implementation plan for meeting the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) goals.

This report captures the collective activities, achievements, and progress of the food access, housing security, mental health, data and evaluation subcommittees in 2024.

The work completed to date reflects the collaborative actions of community - residents, leaders, organizations, government departments, managed care plans and industry partners.

Public Health Advocates (PHA) is a contracted agency funded by Sacramento County Public Health (SCPH) to facilitate the development of the CHIP in Sacramento County.



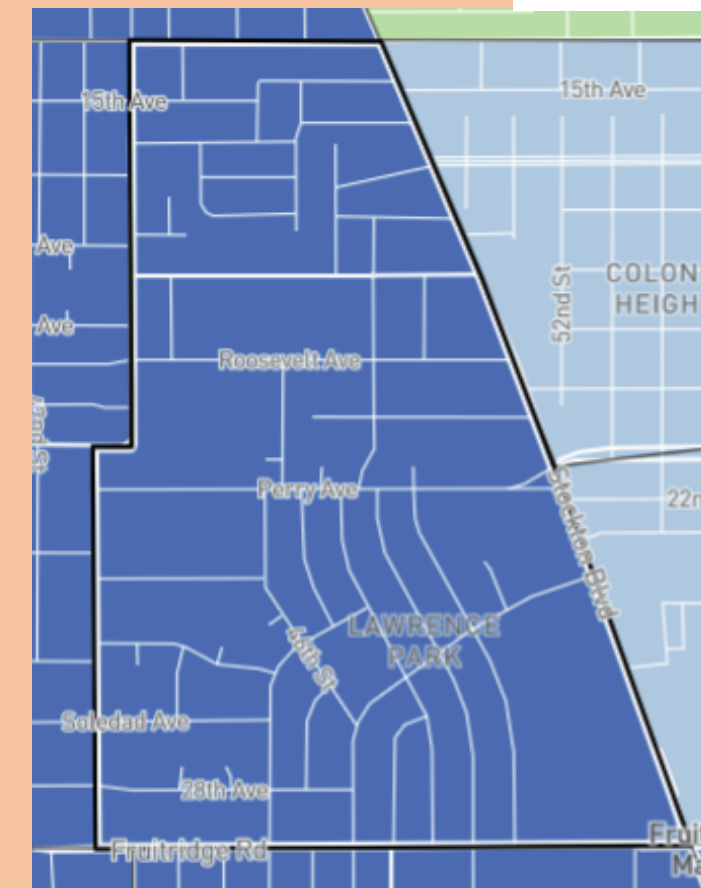
# About CHIP in 44.01

Sacramento County Public Health aims to implement the CHIP in census tract 44.01 with the understanding that conditions in the environment where people are *born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age* affect a wide range of health, functioning, quality-of-life outcomes, and risks.

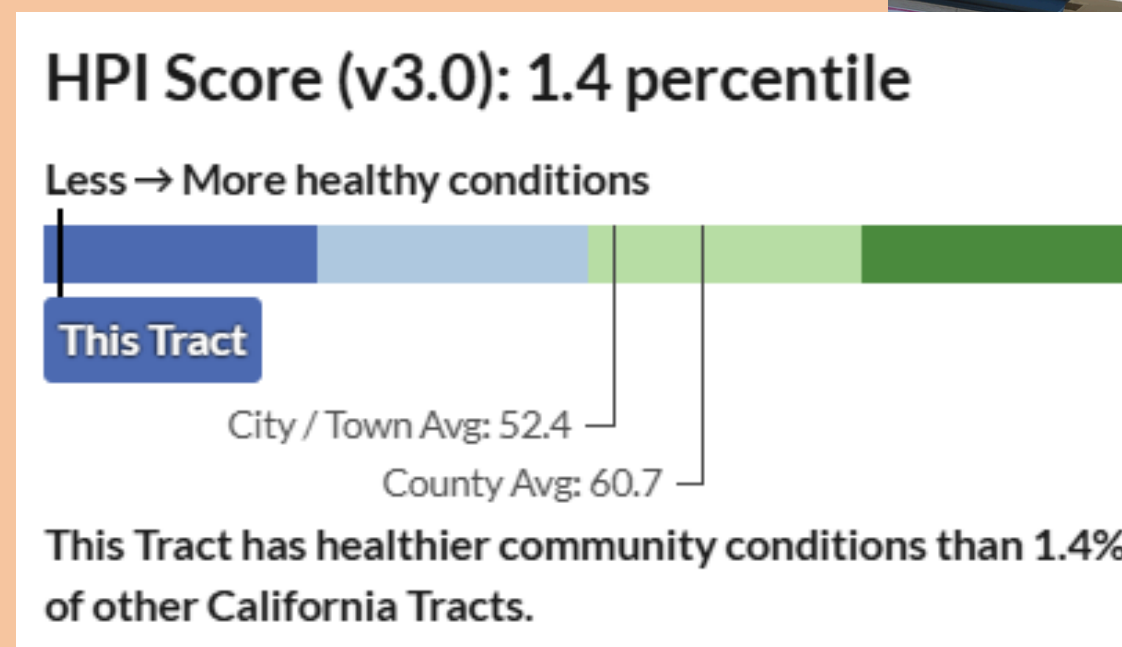
The CHIP Coalition chose to focus on Census Tract 44.01, which has the lowest Healthy Places Index (HPI) score in Sacramento County. A low HPI score shows a community faces more barriers to healthy outcomes due to social determinants it experiences.

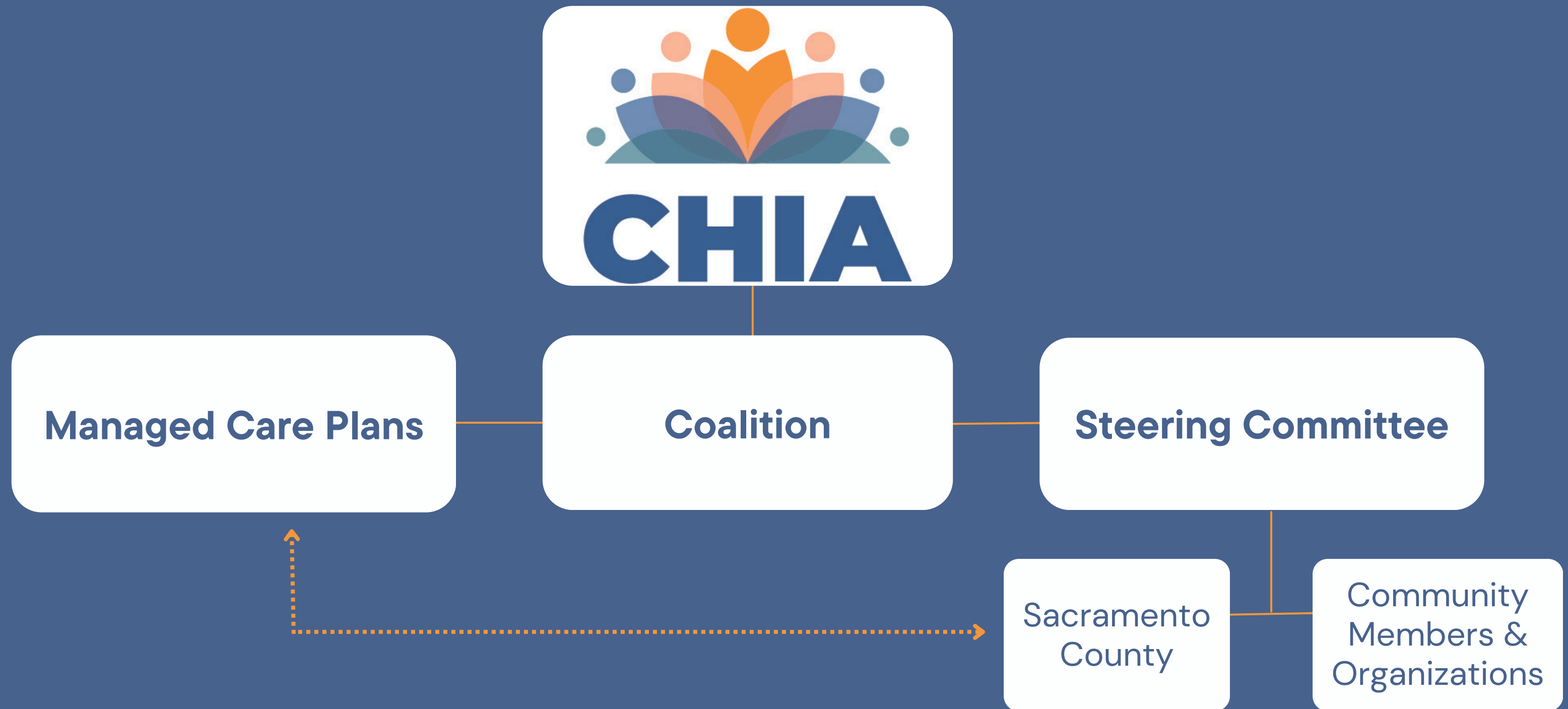

- Train 30 youth and adult community members on community organizing and policy advocacy to lead community outreach by December 2025

## INCOME & EMPLOYMENT

### Goal 2



**Increase income through  
program eligibility and  
employment to reduce poverty**

Increase the percentage of people with incomes above 200% of the federal poverty level from 38.1% to 65% by December 2028, to begin in 2025.

- Hold at least two partner-led annual outreach events focused on union apprenticeships, job training, entrepreneurship, career pathways, community college enrollment and financing.
- Host at least three annual enrollment events for eligible census tract 44.01 residents to access tax credits, social service benefits, and financial empowerment opportunities.
- Develop and train 100 youth and adults that collaborate with CHIP Coalition members to advocate for policies addressing income insufficiency in Sacramento County.

# FOOD ACCESS

## Goal 3

### Activities accomplished:

The Food System Assessment (FSA) was completed in July 2024 by the Sacramento Food Policy Council.

The subcommittee completed a visioning process outlining **themes** to consider to move food system work forward:

- Food Access - economic barriers and general food access
- Culturally responsive foods
- Community Gardens
- Education, Health, Policy and Planning
- Sacramento Food Policy Council and other partners

The Community Food Action Plan (CFAP) RFA was released in December 2024. The consultant will compose a Countywide CFAP outlining a shared vision, goals, and actions for local food system change. The CFAP will be informed by the subcommittee and local case studies of best practices and challenges.

The committee is focused on identifying effective strategies and approaches to address eviction prevention and improve housing stability in the area.

Activities accomplished:

- Completed site observations at the county eviction court
- Met with 211 and housing legal aid providers
- Built on strengths and values, and partnered with Sacramento Housing Collaborative
- Convened subcommittee monthly

## Activities accomplished & planned:

- Managed Care Plans (MCPs) collaboration -- Anthem, Health Net, Kaiser Permanente, and Molina, are working to analyze data on how residents in 44.01 access mental health and behavioral services.
- In collaboration, MCPs and Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) programs, will create a media and communications campaign that will launch in 2025 to raise awareness of the 9-8-8 lifeline.
